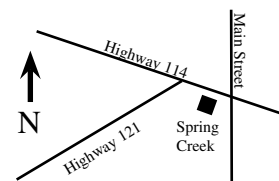

Crocheting for Kids

Purchasing handmade scarf from me will enable you to help a Texas child in need. All profits will be donated to the A. Fern Norville Children's Emergency Shelter to be used for anything from brownie mixes to school supplies, from toothbrushes to clothing, from medicines to toys.

Rick and Lareta Williams have devoted the last 14 years of their lives as "house parents" at the shelter, literally living at the shelter, caring for and loving the children as their own. They are licensed to accept place-

ments from anywhere in the state of Texas. There is a full time nurse on staff that allows them to care for children injured from burns or broken bones...or other special needs. Their specialty is caring for large sibling groups that would otherwise be separated for placement. They also provide guidance for a large number of teen moms with babies.

Ages of the children that come to Kaufman range from birth to seventeen years old. The shelter has a 20-bed capacity that provides services for 180-200 children per year, and they average 12-14 children per day in a year's time. The per diem they receive per child covers about 70% of actual cost...the rest is up to private individuals, churches, and groups such as the DFW Freedom Riders Motorcycle Club.

HRCA Ride for Kids

Thanks for having me and the Martinez family out to the meeting last night. Always good to spend some time with your group. I have three quick follow ups for you.

First, I thought you might want the ride site to put on your club calendar online or where you might post your rides. It is <http://www.pbtfus.org/rideforkids/calendar/2009/dallasfortworth.html>

The second is the info I promised for folks who would like to be able to take online donations (just like the ladies are for the Komen 3 day). Invariably, the people who use this kind of service raise more money (by about twice) than the folks who don't. I believe that's because it's so easy to send an email to more people

to ask for "sponsor" donations. If you want to set up a team site that club members can link to that will track the donation total for the team, have the team "captain" do this:

* Go to www.FirstGiving.com/PBTFUS and select Join a Team in the "Want to raise money?" box.

* Select the Dallas/Fort Worth ride and log in or register for a free account

* When the next page about joining teams comes up, select "Add a New Team" and follow the directions to create the page. All this takes about 5-10 minutes.

* Then, just let your members know what the team name and page link is so that they can go to it and just select Join Now and in 5 minutes they are set to go

If you don't want to do this with a team site, people can just individually go to the same site www.FirstGiving.com/PBTFUS and then

* Click on Get Started and select the Dallas/Fort Worth ride

* Register for free and follow the directions

* In 5 minutes, they are ready to take online donations

Now, the most important thing for everyone to be successful with this is to email as many people as possible that they know and ask for a donation to support them in the ride. Without doing this, having the page doesn't do a whole lot. The site has a tool with a form email that people can modify and send out with just a few minutes effort. It will even send automated thank you notes (customizable) to people who donate through your site. The mistake some folks make is to only email a few people they think will donate. Every year, I hear stories from folks who email the largest part of their email directory of friends, family, co-workers, etc. and they tell me about how someone they didn't expect would donate actually did and how someone they expected would donate didn't. You just never know.

We consistently have donations come from friends in Europe and South America in addition to people who live just down the street or who we see at church. Big list = big success.

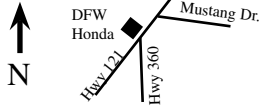
